SEPTEMBER 2023 CLASS BUILDING: As we move towards the next school year, you may be interested in how classes are created each year. Here is some information to help you understand the process.

In June, **the complex process of organizing classes begins**. **Many variables are considered** when creating classes for the following year. Some of these considerations are academic achievement, special needs, leadership skills, social and emotional needs and creating balanced learning environments. Our whole school team is part of the conversation for determining the best learning environment for each child. Please trust in the knowledge that we already have of the students and that we will use our best collective decision for each placement.

Consideration is also given to **class size** and the number of **Ministry designated students** in a class. The **school district has to approve our organization** and the number of classes based on the enrolment we have in the school.

This number usually changes between June and September as students move in and out of the area. It is necessary for us to use strategies such as **combined classes** to ensure we have a few spaces at each grade level for new students throughout the year. **Numbers dictate** how we structure the class combinations. In some cases, we are able to have each grade move as a co-hort to the next grade, particularly in French Immersion.

All learning opportunities that are created will meet the academic needs of your child.

If there is **any additional information** that we require from you to help us with this process, we will contact you directly.

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Tips to make reading an enjoyable experience for your child:

- Let your child choose what to read. Kids are more likely to enjoy reading when they have the freedom to pick their own books.
- Ask questions about what your child is reading. Try asking questions that don't have right answers, like "what do you think will happen next?" or "tell me more about your favourite character?" When you talk while reading, your child gets more involved in the story.
- Encourage reading every day. Set a special time or place for reading. The more kids read the more they will enjoy it.
- Chat with your local children's librarian for book recommendations for your family.
