





Communicating student learning is a vital component of the learning process and fundamental to student success. It is an ongoing process that takes place throughout the school year involving the teacher, student and family. In the 2023-24 school year, there will be some shift in the traditional format.

What is new?

- Student reporting practices that align with BC curriculum and provincial assessment system
- Provincial Proficiency Scale (above) vs. grades or percentages for students in grades K-9
- Student selfassessment of Core Competencies and goal seeing in all grades in all three reports

Why is this important?

Changes to student reporting are the result of many years of engagement and consultation by the Ministry of Education and Child Care with rights holders, education partners, teachers, families, students, and members of the public.

The changes will provide key benefits, including:

- Infomation to students and families on here the student is and how to help them move forward in their learning
- A view of learning as ongoing, and a lifelong process of competency development
